Salmon River Jetboat Races, April 2019, Riggins, Idaho

The jet boat races for 2019 have come and gone. 15 Captains volunteered their boats for this year's race. Thanks to all the captains and their crews, I believe that it was the first time we had safety boats in all locations including the turn arounds.

One safety boat had mechanical problems and stood down on Easter Sunday's race, but the captain helped crew on the Thorson's boat. The races went very well with only one yellow flag for Saturday and maybe a race first with ten race boats starting and finishing all legs (6) of the race without mishap or mechanical failure.

Sunday brought the results of Friday's warm weather and Saturday morning's heavy rainfall, roaring down the river with an increase of over 10,000 CFS to 28,000 CFS. After looking at the changes in Time Zone, the Captains of the FX Class boats decided it was prudent to sit the Sunday Races out rather than risk sinking a boat. Four race boats ran on Sunday with the turbine boat from Spokane running very fast, (this technology continues to amaze me, speed and little sound, crazy stuff when considering where these boats travel. Thanks again to all of the race crews for putting on the show and racing the Famous River of No Return – the Main Salmon River.

We had a good weekend and continue to learn more for next year. I would like to thank all of the boat crews, emergency medical technicians, Hamm radio operators and local volunteers for the time they put in on the river and the race. I would also like to thank Bob Hays for all the guidance he continues to pass along.
