Luckily no one had to lead 17 boats like Jeff did last year.

#### Cold Water Can Kill

Many fatal boating accidents in Idaho are the result of victims involuntarily entering the water from small boats. The average water temperature of Idaho's water is approximately 52 degrees, even during the summer. Wearing a life jacket can greatly increase your risk of surviving a cold water immersion situation.

4 Dangerous Categories of Cold Water Immersion


- Cold Shock: Initial entry 5 minutes: Involuntary gasping, hyperventilation, & vertigo
- 2) Swim Failure: 5 30 minutes: Even the best swimmers cannot function in cold water Muscles, nerves, arms and legs cool quickly Manual dexterity, grip strength and movement speed drop 60-80%
- Hypothermia: 30 minutes or more:
   Depends on water temperature, clothing, body type and behavior
   Heat loss is 25 times faster in the water
- 4) Post Immersion Collapse: Life threatening Heart problems can develop as cold blood is released into the body core from the extremities

To increase your chances of surviving cold water immersion, always wear your life jacket!

## F&G Commission sets 2021 spring season for Chinook salmon

During their meeting on March 18, the Idaho Fish and Game Commission approved spring Chinook fishing on the Snake, Lower Salmon, and Little Salmon rivers to start April 24, and run until August 8 unless closed earlier by the Fish and Game director.



Because returns of Chinook to the Clearwater River are forecasted to be insufficient to meet hatchery broodstock needs, no season was opened on the Clearwater River.

Full rules are available on the Chinook fishing webpage. Printed rules will be available prior to the season opener.



#### Smolt monitoring project weekly updates

Week 1: The Wait The Smolt Monitoring Project crews in Lewiston spent most of their first fish-trapping week clearing debris out of the Snake River fish trap to allow migrating salmon and Steelhead Trout smolts to enter the livewell. While they waited for fishes to arrive, they also collected water condition data such as temperature and flow. Week 2: Training Besides migrating juvenile salmon and steelhead trout, the Snake and Salmon river fish traps can accumulate enormous amounts of large wood during spring runoff. Both trap crews need training so they can safely clear the debris. Week 3: They've Arrived!

The wait for fishes to arrive is over. This week at the Salmon River smolt trap, near White Bird, Fisheries Technicians Ben and Jason handled 1,270 juvenile Chinook salmon. The technicians recorded fish lengths, existing clips, marks, tags, and other biological data. The crew inserted PIT tags in 600 hatchery and 28 wild Chinook salmon, and returned all of them to the river to resume their migration to the Pacific Ocean.

#### Satellite Phone




